G reetings and thank you for taking a moment to review the Fall edition newsletter. The Sanctuary's community newsletter is a great way to

get informed in association news, events, and information. Please be sure to keep the newsletter. It is a great resource!

I would like to take a moment to clarify a few commonly addressed topics. With your help, problems can be greatly reduced. The Board of Directors and management strive to make The Sanctuary one of the most beautiful and safe communities in Oviedo. As a common courtesy to your neighbors, we would like to address the following points:

- Walking your dog: As a friendly reminder, please make sure to pick up and dispose of your pet's waste properly. It only takes a moment, keeps the community looking beautiful, and prevents anyone from stepping on an unpleasant surprise.
 "All pets shall be kept on a leash and no pets shall be allowed to roam unattended." This is a County Ordinance.
- Parking: An increased number of cars parked on the street from time to time have caused congestion on the streets. We want to make sure all vehicles (personal, delivery, and emergency) are able to navigate the neighborhood. Be aware that if you are not properly parked and/or causing congestion, residents can receive a community violation and/or be given a citation from the police department. To prevent any problems, please utilize your garages and driveways.
- Speeding: Remember, for the safety of our children and for everyone in The Sanctuary, please abide by the posted speed limits.
- > Trash/debris: Please keep all trash and recycling

Changes of this nature can be paint color, building a fence, landscaping, adding structures to your property, etc. Any exterior changes require approval of through an architectural review application. Halloween Trick or Treat Tips for your Little Ones:

- Help your child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make it fire proof, the eye holes should be large enough for good peripheral vision.
- If you set jack-o-lanterns on your porch with candles in them, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that kids costumes won't accidentally be set on fire.
- Make sure that if your child is carrying a prop, such as a scythe, butcher knife or a pitchfork, that the tips are smooth and flexible enough to not cause injury if fallen on.
- Kids always want to help with the pumpkin carving. Small children shouldn't be allowed to use a sharp knife to cut the top or the face. There are many kits available that come with tiny saws that work better then knives and are safer, although you can be cut by them as well. It's best to let the kids clean out the pumpkin and draw a face on it, which you can carve for them.



- Treating your kids to a spooky Halloween dinner will make them less likely to eat the candy they collect before you have a chance to check it for them.
- Teaching your kids basic everyday safety such as not getting into cars or talking to strangers, watching both ways before crossing streets and crossing when the lights tell you to, will help make them safer when they are out Trick or Treating.
- Make Halloween a fun, safe and happy time for your kids and they'll carry on the tradition that you taught them to their own families some day!

Landscape Committee Update

The Landscape Committee met on Saturday, July 15, 2006 to discuss needed improvements to the Village signs. Seven members were in attendance. Issues ranged from overgrowth in front of sign lettering and lights to desired additional plantings. Bids were reviewed, constructive recommendations were documented and all comments were copied and subsequently provided to the Board on Wednesday 19 July 2006. Our manager will be first soliciting some quotes on lettering and lighting adjustments.

Other landscape-related issues were also communicated for Board consideration. Perhaps most especially, the Committee expressed concern about litter control. Our current lawn maintenance company was documented by one member to have shred existing litter into a worse nuisance. Our manager will remind the company to pick up such litter. HOA members are always welcome to offer opinions and constructive landscape recommendations at our monthly Board meetings. Thanks.

Playground Committee Report



e have received a proposal for the installation of GameTime playground equipment designed for 2-5 year olds (this would be in addition to the existing play set which is

geared towards 5-12 year olds).

Additionally, we are proposing the installation of 4 swings and 3 stationary riding toys in an expanded playground area that will encompass the unused grassy area between the parking lot and the existing play set. We are also finalizing quotes for new fencing and landscaping to enhance the area.

Update to Playground Committee Report from Michael Woodman, President, Board of Directors: A t the Board of Directors Meeting on August 16, the Board approved expenditure of funds to begin work on the expanded playground.

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A Message from the Covenants Committee

A swith any neighborhood, ours is very diverse with people from all walks of life. However, one area where we all have common ground is the Covenants and Restrictions of the Association. These are the rules we all legally agreed to abide by when purchasing a home in the neighborhood.

A desirable neighborhood does not happen by accident, it is the product of deliberate and consistent adherence to the rules. It only takes a few inconsiderate people to detract from the neighborhood appeal. Please take the time to review your copy of the Covenants and Restrictions. If you do not have a copy, please contact Don Asher management.

As a reminder, here are a few of the more common rules:

Ards must be maintained properly including:

- Mowing and edging on a regular basis (At least once a week in the summer)
- Edging includes all sidewalks and the side of the house.
- Plant beds must be free of weeds and/or overgrown grass.
- A Lawn must be fertilized and weeded to maintain proper healthy appearance.
- Any patches of dead grass must be re-sodded.
- Ensure that grass/weeds do not grow in the paver cracks.

All pets shall be kept on a leash and no pets shall be allowed to roam unattended.

All residents MUST CLEAN UP after their pets.

- Basketball poles must be hidden from view after sunset.
- Any rentals or leases must give written notice to the Board within 10 days of execution.
- Trash must be in SECURED containers to prevent it from blowing away.
- Trash cannot be placed in the open prior to sunset the day before collection.
