MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

armest greetings from your Sanctuary HOA Board of Directors. We are working hard to ensure that our neighborhood and facilities are kept up to a standard of excellence that we can all be proud of. Since taking the reigns of the board from the builder, Crosswinds, we have made numerous changes to the staffing and running of our HOA. Below is a partial list of what we have already done and what we are currently working on:

- ➤ We hired Don Asher and Associates as our new property management company. Tom Tempfer, our property manager from Asher, has been a wonderful change and has years of experience.
- > We put out for bid the contracts for ALL services being performed on behalf of the HOA (legal, engineering, cleaning, landscaping, pool maintenance, etc.). We have hired a number of new companies that are doing a much better job than the previous vendors.
- Security was hired early on to provide protection and ensure proper treatment of the Clubhouse. We will continue to seek improvements in this area as we determine the best possible way to run our beautiful center.
- Landscaping improvements to the east entrance have been carefully studied by the landscaping committee and approved by the board. Work should be commencing shortly with substantial improvements.
- Clubhouse rules have been updated and mailed to ALL homeowners. If you do not remember receiving them they are available at the Clubhouse. Please read through them as Security and Clubhouse staff will be enforcing the rules.
- Two Clubhouse Directors have been hired on a part-time basis to assist in the management of the center. Both are very qualified and are serious about making our

facilities and community the best they can be. If you are interested in being on a committee, helping with the

- We have a new **website www.thesanctuaryhoa.org** that has been up and running for several months. The site will be continually under improvement and adjustment, but please use it to learn more about what is happening at The Sanctuary HOA.
- We have hired an engineering company to do a thorough evaluation of the Clubhouse, and all common properties to determine if there are issues that need to be addressed and corrected.
- Several committees have been formed and are meeting actively. These include landscaping, architectural review, social/welcome, playground, security, and more. If you are interested in volunteering for one of these committees, or would like to start a committee please contact the center office at **407 971-9749**.
- ➤ And more! If you are interested in learning about what we have been doing please visit the website or come to a board meeting. We meet the third Wednesday of every month (next meeting is June 21st) at 6:30-8pm in the Clubhouse.

Thank you for your support as we work through this first year of The Sanctuary HOA. Our goal is to make sure that The Sanctuary is the premier neighborhood in Oviedo, and central Florida. As you visit the Clubhouse please make sure to come in between 9am-3pm to say hi to Barbara and Nikki. We have many more projects that we are considering (photo ID system for residents and their 13 and over dependents, playground upgrades, etc.) and will hopefully be implemented soon.

Pool Rules:

- Operating hours are dawn to dusk.
- △ One card will be issued per home. Additional cards will be \$35 each.
- The pool and its facilities are for the use of The Sanctuary residents and their accompanied guests. Please limit your guests to a reasonable number. The community center staff can make special arrangements if needed.
- Children under 13 are not permitted at the pool area unless accompanied by and under the direct supervision of their parents or other adult resident.
- Suntan oils and body lotions clog the pool filter and drain.
- Please shower prior to entering the pool.
- Diaper aged children MUST wear rubber pants in the pool.
- ⇒ Proper swimming attire is required. NO jeans or cutoffs are allowed.
- NO GLASS ALLOWED IN THE POOL AREA. Other food and drinks must be kept 10 feet from the pool edge.
- Please clean up debris in the proper containers provided.
- ∴ No smoking. No alcohol.
- ⇒ NO DIVING ALLOWED. No running, rough housing, or dunking allowed.
- NO balls, Frisbees, or similar type toys allowed in pool area.

- Anyone caught swimming after hours or vandalizing community areas will be subject to having their privileges revoked or possible charges filed.
- ➣ Violators of the pool rules will be asked to conform or leave the pool area. Repeated violations of the rules will result in suspension of pool privileges.
- THIS AREA WILL BE MONITORED AND RECORDED, THE HOLDER OF THE CARD OR ANY MEMBER OF A HOUSEHOLD FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF THESE RESTRICTIONS WILL BE EITHER ARRESTED OR RESPONSIBLE FOR REIMBURSING THE ASSOCIATION FOR THE DAMAGE.

RESERVE THE CLUBHOUSE

You, as a homeowner can reserve the Clubhouse. Remember, other Residents are using the facility so reserve early. Only one pool party per day is permitted. There is a \$25 charge for rental and a \$100 security deposit. The security deposit will be returned to you only if the room or area is left clean and set the way it was when you rented it. Maximum of 25 people. Please call 407 971-9749 and speak to Nikki or Barbara to reserve.



Architectural Review Reminder

Prior to commencing any exterior work within the scope of Article IV of our covenants, the homeowner shall submit an application for approval. The appropriate ARB application form can be found on our

website **www.thesanctuaryhoa.org** or at the Clubhouse. It has come to our attention that many homeowners are

overlooking and have overlooked this requirement. This is especially true with the installation of hurricane shutters. If you have done work and have not filed an application, please submit it after the fact!

Should you be contemplating work, please allow for a 30 day review cycle. Applications should be complete containing *detailed information* per Paragraph 4.3 *Guidelines and Procedures*, sub paragraph 3. (b).

It's Hurricane Season. Are You Prepared?

Helpful Tips to Keep You Safe During a Hurricane

Pre-Season

- > Enter the season prepared.
- Make sure your home has storm shutters.
- > Always have plenty of non-perishable foods on hand.

WHEN A WATCH OR WARNING IS ISSUED

- ➤ Leave low lying areas.
- > Protect windows with plywood boards, or storm shutters. Secure outside objects.
- > Make sure you have plenty of fuel and water.
- ➤ Have several days supply of food and water for each family member. If called to evacuate, do so immediately.

BEFORE THE STORM

- > Be ready to put your plan and preparation into action.
- ➤ Pay attention to local weather reports on radio, television, or the internet. Have house boarded up, or have storm shutters in place.
- ➤ Have plenty of food and water.
- Make sure all your tools, supplies, and first aid kit are available for use. Have a secure room available.
- Before the Storm: Tips for your yard: bring in flags and awnings.
- Hurricane safety tips for your vehicle: don't park cars under trees! Firmly stake tall garden plants that could snap in high winds. Store fragile lawn ornaments away, such as gazing balls.
- Remove house ornaments that are not secure, such as fall wreath displays. Check pool covers to ensure that they are secure.
- ➤ Harvest any fragile items in the garden that are mature enough to be picked, including flowers to be used for cut flower arrangements. There's no point in letting the storm wreck them.
- Remember that storms sometimes bring flooding in their wake, and that means potential erosion problems. If you live on a steep slope or close to a body of water, a rather extreme hurricane safety tip you nonetheless might wish to consider is evacuation.
- ➤ In areas of your yard where water is known to pass through, remove any items of value.



DURING THE STORM

- > Stay in Secure Room.
- ➤ Have supplies on hand.
- > Remain indoors when the eye moves over your area because the storm will resume shortly.

- Use stored water and food.
- > Be patient. Things will take a while before they get back to normal.
