would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our four new board members: Tom Cernera, Christin Hards, Bill Tidwell and Alycia Wood. I look forward to working with each of you. Thank you to our former board for all their hard work.

In a separate announcement in this newsletter, we have outlined the procedure for obtaining your photo ID. This photo ID will be used for entry to the amenity center, pool, playground and tennis courts. Please make a note of the dates and times that the staff will be available and schedule time to take care of getting your photo ID. Also note that you will need to bring all family members 13 and over and will be asked to fill out registration information. Proof of residency will be checked at this time, so bring documents with your name and address.

Another issue we are addressing is the possibility of the requested speed

bumps. For the safety of our residents, we are exploring the possibility of "Traffic Calmers". These have been installed on Lake Jessup Ave. and also on Artesia, if you would like to take a look. The City of Oviedo will conduct a study to determine if we qualify for installation. If we do qualify, it will then be put to a community vote and 55% approval from residents will be necessary.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

by Tom Cernera, ARC Chairman As we see that our community is finally being completed, many of us are now considering improving our properties and developing a plan for projects that will personalize our homes. One of the reasons we chose to purchase homes in The Sanctuary was because we appreciate the overall look and feel of the community. With this in mind, we need to recognize the fact that we have accepted community oversight of our projects and improvements. We want - and need them to blend into the overall appeal of The Sanctuary.

The ARC is that oversight group made up of neighbors whose only goal is to enhance and protect the appearance of the community and apply consistent opinions regarding the restrictions and covenants. It is the job of

this group to review all applications for pool installations, screen enclosures, landscape modifications, paint schemes and numerous other projects that affect the exterior of our homes. After reviewing each application, we approve or reject the application based on the community standards, past experience and aesthetic value. We can also comment and ask that modifications be made to a plan so the project complies with the standards, before costly changes (after the fact) are required by the residents. The approval rate is high and in general, lifestyles and individual preferences have been respected.

be paying closer attention to requests for fences. Since fences impact multiple home sites, it is important that the neighbors be considered. The community will be reviewed and fencing will be evaluated and mapped. The goal is to provide safety and privacy while protecting views and community appeal. Site visits may be required before approvals are granted. It is also our goal to review the guidelines and standards to bring them in line with the changes that have been allowed over the past few years.

It is the intention of the ARC to work with homeowners, not to make life difficult. To do this, we need your cooperation. Please submit applications for all exterior improvements and modifications to your property. If you are not clear on what is permissible under the covenants, please ask. If you have had

work done that has not been previously approved, please make a request for approval. If you have work under construction presently, please ask your contractor to remove any signage that could be considered as advertising or promoting that business. The only allowable material would be permits that are required to be displayed by law.

The work of the ARC is vital to this community. If you wish to participate or have questions regarding your projects, call Tom Cernera 407-977-3862. Applications can be downloaded from our website www.thesanctuaryhoa.org and are available at the Amenity Center Office.

Thanks for your vote and thanks for cooperating.
